Peace Process highlights

- Armed clashes escalated between the Tatmadaw and TNLA, KIA, MNDAA, EAOs in Shan State and Kachin State.
- 2. The 2nd Session of UPC-21st Century Panglong was held in MICC 2, NayPayTaw. 910 representatives participated in the discussion between 24-29 of May and 16.9% were women. 37 out of 46 basic federal principles were agreed as National Accord Part 1. There are arguments that these principles are not represented nationwide. No-secession from Union topic dominated the conference.
- 3. FPNCC 7 EAOs attended the opening ceremony of the 2nd Session of 21st Century Panglong and met with Peace Commission and State Counsellor but not participated in the discussion of basic principles for federalism. Chinese government is playing the major role in this meeting and attending the conference.
- 4. UNFC boycotted the 2nd Session of UPC-21st Century Panglong because in their role they were prohibited to participate in the discussion. Non-NCA EAOs need to sign Deed of Commitment or NCA to be allowed participating in the discussion of political dialogue. KIO/KIA and WNO/A submitted membership resignation letter to UNFC
- ALP and RCSS/SSA still not granted to conduct Ethnic based National-level Dialogue even though the other of NCA signed were able to conduct.
- JMC-S Joint office for RCSS/SAA and PNLO opened in Kholem, Namhsam Township, South Shan State. RCSS donated fund MMK 15m for office operating costs.
- JCB received peace fund MMK 15.45bn from about 150 individual public donations at the date of 19th May 2017.
- The UN named a three-person fact finding team to investigate Rakhine crackdown last year which is rejected by Myanmar govt.
