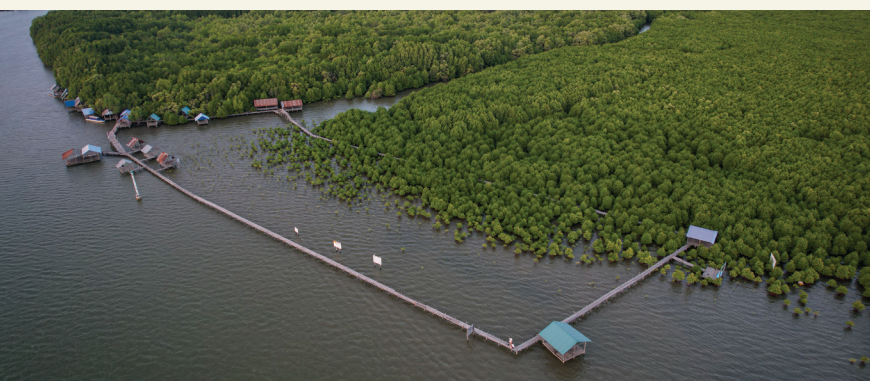


Trapeang Sangkæ Community Fishery in Kampot Province (2017)

OVERVIEW

Trapeang Sangkæ Community Fishery is located in Trapeang Sangkæ, Kampong Kaes and Trapeang Thum villages, Trapeang Sangkæ commune, Tuek Chhou district, Kampot province. The community has a total areas of 337 hectares. The community has the total of 2,027 members (1,029 females) in 2009 and 758 members (369 females) in 2017 which includes 09 communities fisheries committee (03 females). In 2017, the community has updated its document and map which divided into 03 areas such as fishing areas 415 hectares, mangrove protection center 0.7 hectares, and tourism center 0.81 hectares.

Community Fisheries Management Plan

Community Fisheries Management Plan shall be prepared in accordance with Article 23 of the Prakas on Community Fisheries Guidelines of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishery (MAFF), based on the information related to the socio-economic status of the people, fisheries, and agriculture, the nature of the fishery involved in fishing, and community issues. Trapeang Sangkae Community Fishery has developed a five-year plan focusing on improving community livelihoods through co-management of sustainable and equitable use of fisheries and natural resources. From the community perspective, the community has also developed a five-year Strategic Plan (2017-2021).

Trapeang Sangkae Community Fishery has developed a 0.81-hectare ecotourism development plan for a mangrove management area. Ecotourism community not only plays an important role in improving the livelihood of the community, but also contribute to increasing and restoring mangrove resources. The community plans to increase the number of fishing pools within the community.

Budget Plan: The budget of the community is dependent because it still depends on the donations from the community members, donations from donors, and assistance from the RGC, international NGOs, local NGOs, as well as commune development budget.

The potential sites that could create a management area lies in the community fishery, which is divided into two areas including a 40-hectare seagrass management area and a 57-hectare mangrove management area.
